



## Pupil Premium Allocation 2015-2016

As you may be aware, the Government give additional funding to schools for Looked after children, children with a parent in the armed forces, and children who are in receipt of Free School Meals (or have been within the past 6 years). This funding is known as Pupil Premium Funding. Without this additional funding, many of the opportunities that all children have benefitted from would not have been able to happen. These opportunities develop and foster the children's love of learning; impacting on their attainment and progress in all areas of the curriculum.

Although all children in Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1 do receive a free school meal, the funding is only for those children who are registered. Families in receipt of certain benefits can apply for Free School Meals for their child and the Pupil Premium is then allocated to the school. Currently this amounts to £1300 per child (£1900 for looked after children and £300 for those with a parent in the armed forces).

**This year we have 51 children who are in receipt of the Pupil Premium.**

### Nature of Support

We monitor the progress of all children very closely. This includes looking at individual children's progress and comparing the progress of different groups of children.
