



Woodcote Primary School Pupil Premium Allocation 2017-2018

As you may be aware, the Government give additional funding to schools for Looked after children, children with a parent in the armed forces, and children who are in receipt of Free School Meals (or have been within the past 6 years). This funding is known as Pupil Premium Funding. Without this additional funding, many of the opportunities that all children have benefitted from would not have been able to happen. These opportunities develop and foster the children's love of learning; impacting on their attainment and progress in all areas of the curriculum.

Although all children in Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1 do receive a free school meal, the funding is only for those children who are registered. Families in receipt of certain benefits can apply for Free School Meals for their child and the Pupil Premium is then allocated to the school. Currently this amounts to £1300 per child (£1900 for looked after children and £300 for those with a parent in the armed forces).

Nature of Support

- To raise self-esteem, improve confidence and develop social skills
- To improve and develop a positive learning attitude through enhancing the provision
- To improve basic skills so that the curriculum can be accessed
- Accelerating progress and improving attainment
- Giving children access experiences that they otherwise would not be able to; enhancing the learning opportunities to access enrichment activities

Proposed Spending 2017-2018 with an expected budget of £60,000

Action Summary	How the impact will be monitored
<p>A Pupil Premium Champion to work with all children across the school. She will ensure that all children have individual short-term targets to work on their areas of need. Children will have 1:1 time as needed or work in small groups where needs are similar. The role will develop throughout the year and reflect the needs of individual children. The pupil premium Champion will work alongside children in Year 1 and 2 in their classrooms during morning sessions to address learning needs and misconceptions at the point of learning. Work with other Year groups will be undertaken during the afternoon sessions. The Pupil Premium Champion will work alongside the Achievement for All Champion and Deputy, liaising with children, staff and parents.</p>	<p>Individual action plans will be monitored by teachers and team leaders.
